**REPORT:** Favorable, 5-0 (In Favor: Council Members Glaros, Harrison, Lehman, Taveras, and Turner.)

The Public Safety and Fiscal Management Committee convened on October 26, 2017 to interview nominees for the Human Relations Commission. The Human Relations Commission works to eliminate discriminatory practices within Prince George's County through advocacy, education, mediation and the investigation of complaints and enforcement of discrimination laws.

Two individuals, Mr. Jonathan Medlock and Ms. MaKelia Mitchell are being appointed.

Four individuals, Ms. Katrina Burson, Ms. Nora Eidelman, Ms. A. Janelle Johnson and Mr. Troy Loew are being reappointed.
