Dear Mr. Gorrell:

The purpose of this joint signature letter is to fully endorse the Prince George's County Board of Education's proposed FY 2019 capital budget request and to identify the projects that this County considers most critical. This funding endorsement is consistent with the County's priorities – construction funding for projects that have received State planning approval, approval of planning requests, support for systemic replacements, renovation projects, and reimbursement for forward funded projects.

The Board's FY 2019 funding request of \$83.4 million addresses the many needs faced by our County's schools such as the completion of previously approved projects and critical systemic repair projects of which some have been expanded to be more holistic. It also reflects the advancement of a comprehensive modernization program (estimated at \$8 billion and contained within the FY 2017 Educational Facilities Master Plan) aimed at improving both the physical condition and education adequacy through space for enhanced educational programming. The County supports the Board's FY 2019 funding request.

The first priority is to request State funding for those projects that have received State planning approval. These projects include:

Our second priority addresses projects that are currently under design and in need of State planning approval. Included among this group is the first set of prioritized projects that seek to implement the long-range vision for modernization. Granting planning approval for these projects will enable the County to move forward on these new construction projects. These projects include:
