- These two centers currently have **99** full-time employees



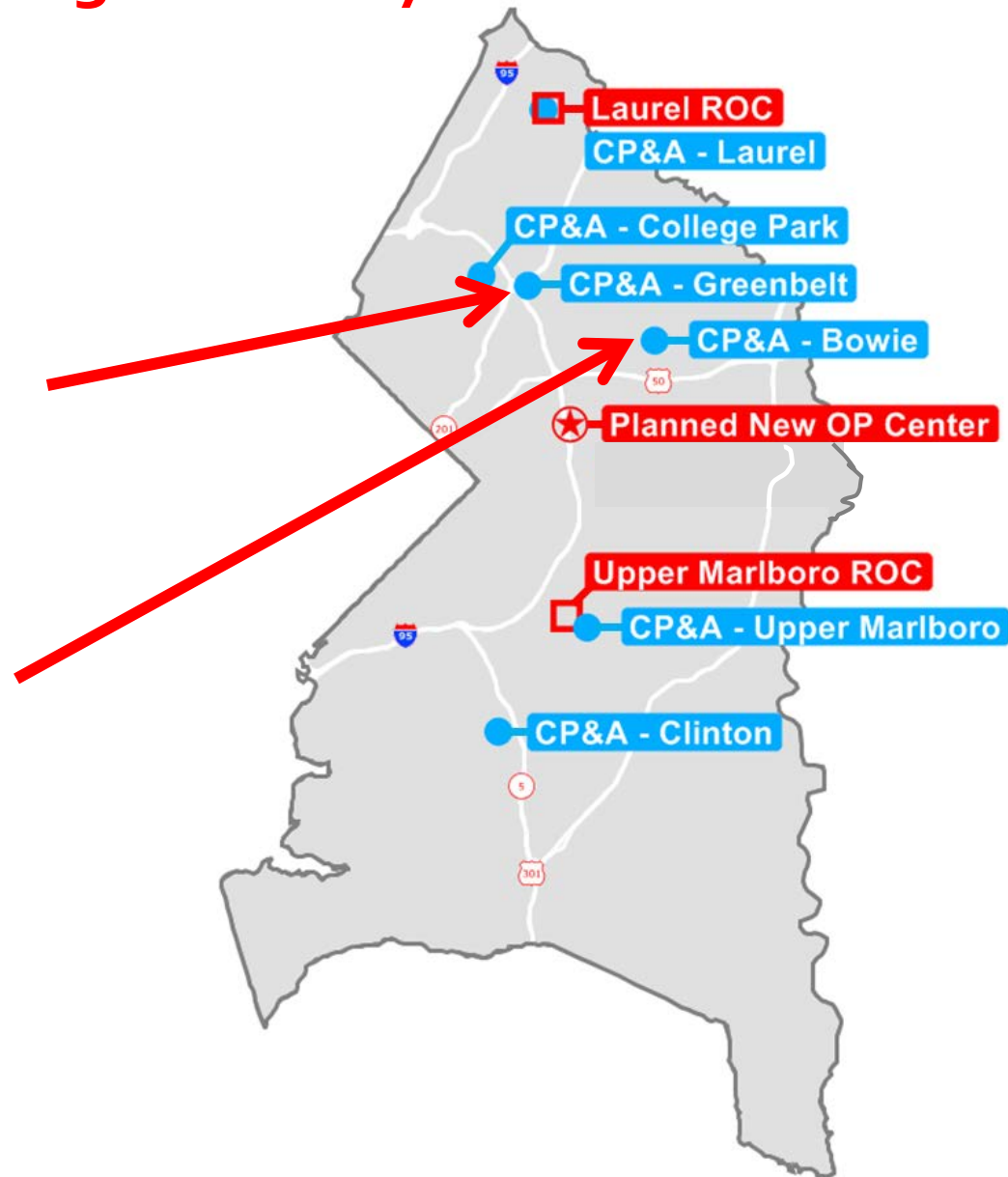

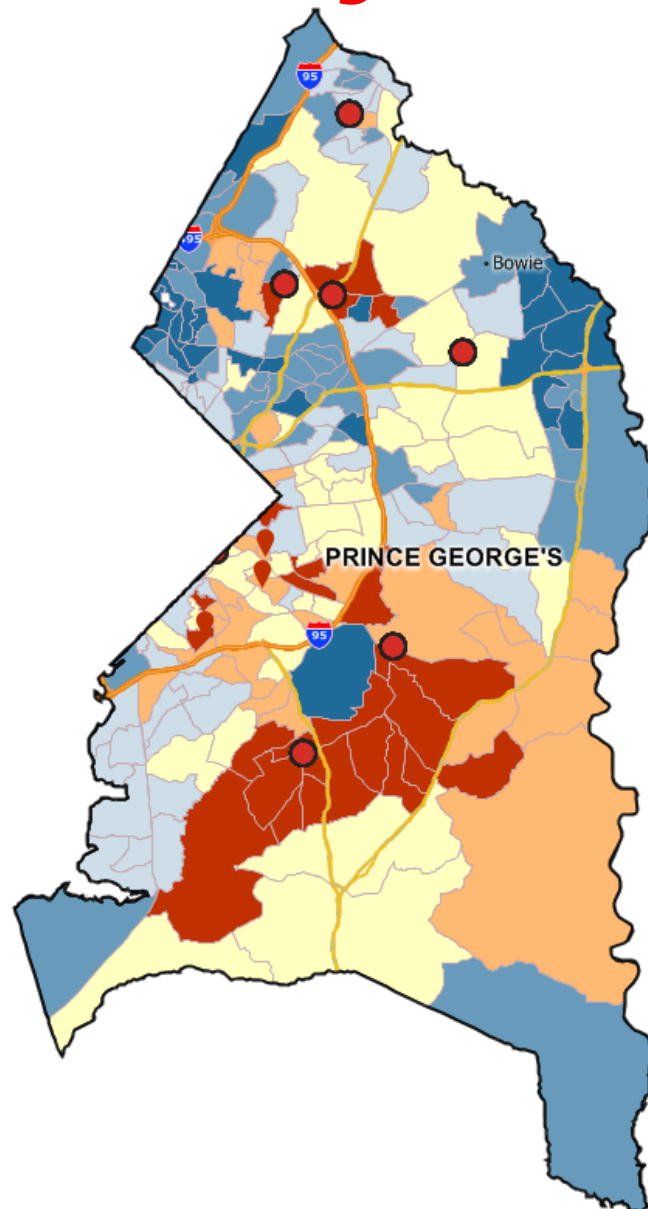

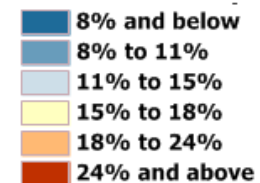

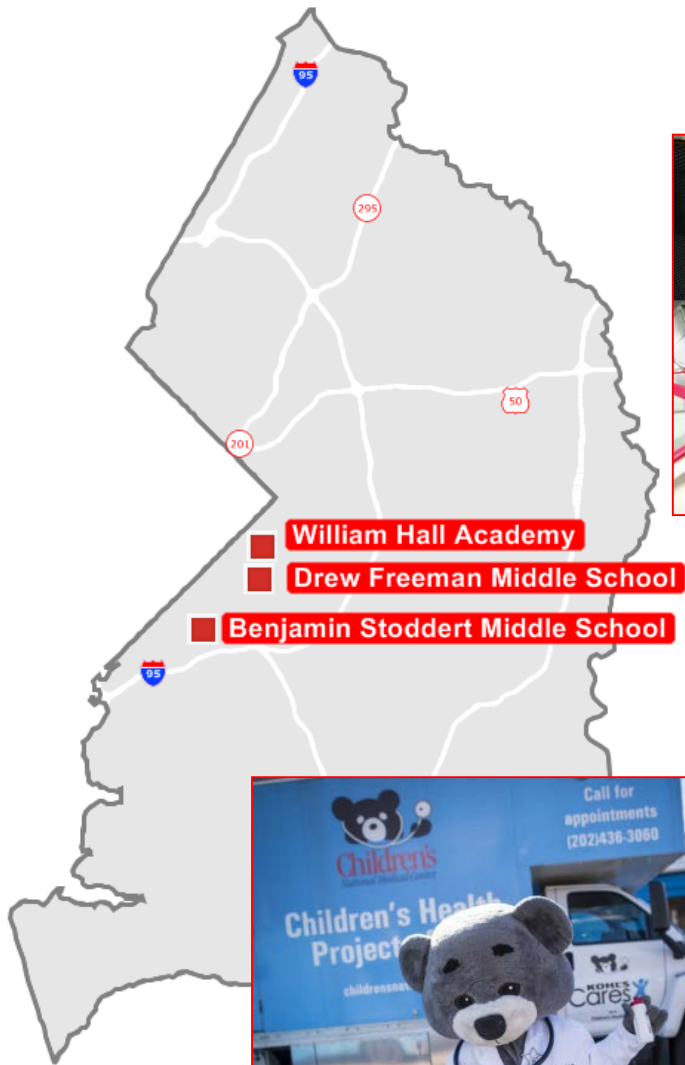

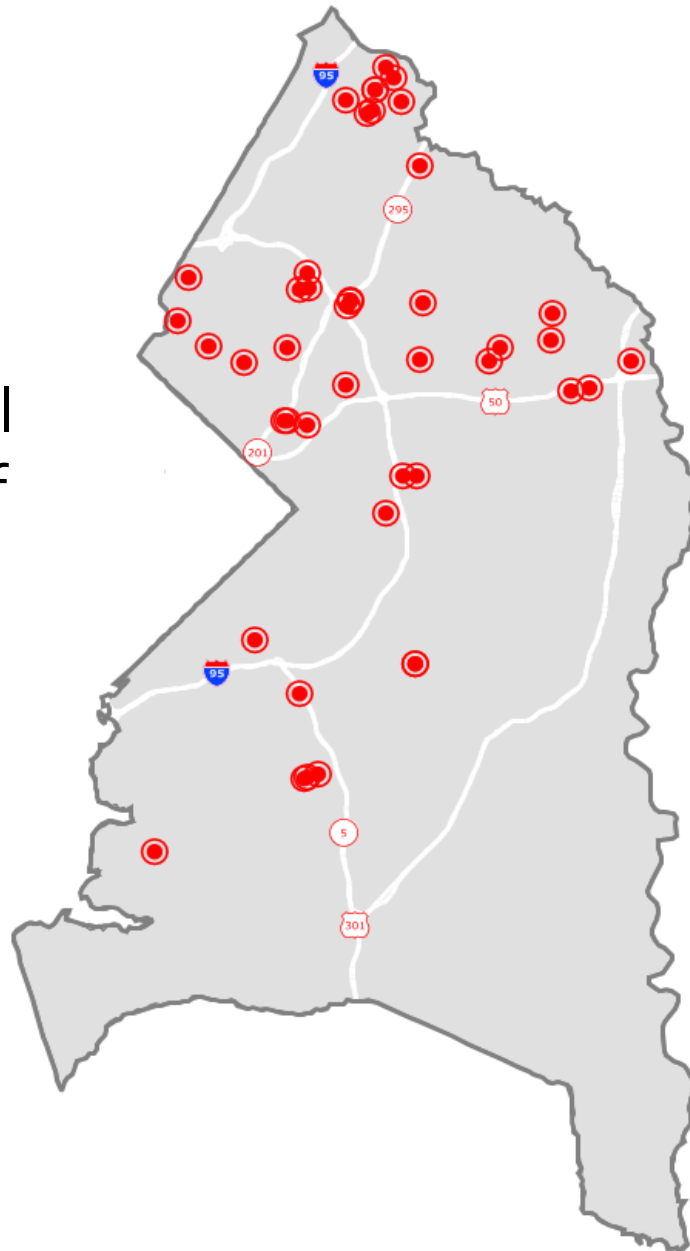

A Significant Economic Contributor

- Children's National employs **1700** Prince George's County residents
 - Median salary of a Children's National employee who lives in Prince George's County: **\$51,143**
 - Children's National salaries are **37%** higher than the average annual salary of a resident in Prince George's County
 - And **29%** higher than the average salary of a Maryland resident.

Primary Care Expansion

- Adding 4 additional exam rooms in our Greenbelt practice to accommodate additional patients
- Recruiting additional providers at our Bowie practice.

Successful Legislative Collaboration

Care Coordination

- **Safe and Timely Discharge Study Language in the Maryland Budget** – In 2017, Children's lead the effort to require the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to consult with hospitals and other government agencies and make improvements in the processes used to ensure the safe and timely discharge of pediatric patients at all hospitals serving Maryland children. Children's National was able to champion the inclusion of budget language that earmark funds to support care coordination for critically high risk patients that was approved. The Study is ongoing.



Successful Legislative Collaboration

Behavioral Health Needs Assessment for Public Schools

HB1522, bill name was a collaborative effort co- authored by Children's National and Delegate Hill. This legislation passage was a text book example of working to influence creation of Health Policy that supports children. Children's National was consulted on the and cemented our place as the go-to leading organization on Pediatric Health issues and outcomes Becoming go-to on big bills. (passed)

- Children's National was consulted in the creation of the bill and advised its language
- Children's co- authored the bill submission
- Children's specialist led testimony in support of this bill
- The assessment is ongoing
