EXPLANATION OF ADJUSTMENTS

Office of Central Services

The Pepco/Exelon merger provides additional funding in the amount \$7,874,682 which will continue to support the Sustainable Energy Workforce Development Program, TNI Clean Energy and the Energy Star and Green Leasing Programs. The overarching goal of this initiative is to establish, create and support the development of the energy sector within the County with a goal of creating and providing energy jobs, specialized training certification programs to build the energy employment capacity within the County and to provide grants to citizens that wish to make their homes more energy efficient.

Circuit Court

The Maryland Department of Human Services provides funding to support the Cooperative Reimbursement Agreement which supports child support enforcement services provided by the Circuit Court. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$8 is needed to fully expend the award and cash match funds needed to support this effort.

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded funding in the amount of \$20,000 to support the Economic Justice Initiative. Existing staff compensation in the amount of \$6,667 will be used to meet the cash match requirement. This program assists survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault and sex trafficking in overcoming economic barriers to achieve long-term financial independence and safety. This award supports payment related to contractual services.

The Maryland Judiciary, Administrative Office of the Courts awarded funding in the amount of \$51,550 for the Family Justice Center. This program provides a "one-stop-shop" for victims of domestic violence seeking legal assistance. The grant supports the addition of a Volunteer and Outreach Coordinator to enable the program to increase the number of victims that access the center.

The Maryland Judiciary, Administrative Office of the Courts awarded funding in the amount of \$5,850 to support continuing education and participation in the Center for ADR's Annual Conference for Circuit Court employees.

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded funding in the amount of \$345,625 to support the Family Justice Center's Seeking Justice, Restoring Hope Initiative. This is the second year of funding to maintain and support the general operations of the center. The period of performance is October 1, 2016 through September 30, 2018.

Office of the State's Attorney

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded funding in the amount of \$152,360 to support Project Safe Neighborhoods. This funding will support a full-time assistant state's attorney to work directly with the Police Department's Criminal Intelligence Division and Maryland Parole and Probation to remove repeat violent offenders from targeted areas.

Police Department

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded funding in the amount of \$20,000 to support the Algorithm Project. This program will develop and operationalize a set of algorithms that will aid in the allocation of personnel to designated hot spot areas. Funding will support contractual services.

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded funding in the amount of \$28,550 to support child advocacy training. This program will support overtime costs and specialized training associated with this crime prevention effort.

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded funding in the amount of \$90,000 to support the Internet Crimes against Children Unit. Funding will support salary costs, overtime, and travel and training costs associated with registering this Unit.

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded funding in the amount of \$208,838. Funds will be used to support salary, fringe benefits, overtime and DNA supplies for a limited term grant funded position assigned to the Fire Examination Unit.

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded funding in the amount of \$99,714 for the Sex Offenders Compliance and Enforcement Initiative (SOCEM) which supports the Department's compliance with federal and State regulations regarding the mandatory registration of convicted sex offenders. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$1,714 is needed to fully expend the award funding received.

The Target Corporation awarded funding in the amount of \$13,000 for specialized investigative equipment. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$3,500 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland State Police through the Vehicle Theft Prevention Council awarded funding in the amount of \$350,000 for the Vehicle Theft Prevention Program. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$20,000 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency awarded \$584,400 to purchase additional breaching and ballistic protection gear for the Maryland NCR SWAT Team. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$174,400 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The U.S. Department of Justice awarded funding in the amount of \$562,500 for the Prince George's County Human Trafficking Task Force. Base salary costs of an existing corporal will be used to meet the non-Federal matching costs which total \$187,500 for a period of three years. The funding provided through this cooperative agreement will support the development and enhancement of interdisciplinary human trafficking task forces. The task force will implement victim-centered, collaborative and sustainable approaches to identify, investigate and prosecute sex and labor trafficking cases at the local, state, tribal and federal levels while also providing comprehensive services to the victims of these crimes.

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded funding in the amount of \$57,200 for the Maryland Cease Fire Council-Gun Violence Reduction Grant. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$27,200 is needed to fully expend the award. Funds will be used to support overtime.

Fire/EMS Department

Doctors Community Hospital awarded funding in the amount of \$10,000 to support the hire of a University of Maryland School of Public Health intern to assist with data management for the Mobile Integrated Health program.

The District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency awards funding to Department for various programs under the Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) Program. The Department currently has \$1,350,000 in appropriation authority to support sub-awards. Funding in the amount of \$330,896 will support the Tactical Medical Equipment and Ballistic Protection for Fire/Rescue Grant which provides ballistic vest protection to fire and rescue personnel for maximum protection while providing medical care in an active threat environment. The Mass Casualty Incident Response Support grant in the amount of \$171,207 will support National Capital Region (NCR) first responders in responding to mass casualty incidences through the use of the Handtevy medication system application. This application provides medication and treatment guidelines for chemical and biological events. County-wide licenses (for both Prince George's and Montgomery Counties) will be purchased as well specialized equipment to support ongoing Tactical Emergency Casualty Care (TECC) and tactical EMS projects. The EMS Surge Capacity grant in the amount of \$178,799 will enhance the NCR's ability to create readily deployable caches of ALS equipment to turn BLS units or other first responder apparatus into ALS capable units to expand lifesaving capabilities in the NCR. The First Watch grant in the amount of \$393,094 will expand and complement the First Watch situational awareness software already operational in the NCR through the real-time tracking of resource use/depletion, transportation decisions and healthcare system stresses.

The State of Maryland awarded funding in the amount of \$1,699,001 for the William H. Amoss Fire, Rescue and Ambulance (State 508) Fund. Per State law, these funds may be used for the acquisition or rehabilitation of apparatus and capital equipment, fire and rescue equipment, supplies and for the renovation of facilities used to house apparatus. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$2,001 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The U.S. Department of Homeland Security Federal Emergency Management Agency awarded funding in the amount of \$3,567,229 for the Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) program which has a three year period of performance beginning January 24, 2018 through January 23, 2021. This program requires a cash match in the amount of \$2,217,467 over the life of the grant. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$2,121,029 is needed to reflect the full amount of grant funding received and an additional \$300,000 in matching funds is needed to reflect the amount of funding the County needs to expend for year-one of funding.

The Maryland Department of Health through the Community Health Resources Commission awarded funding in the amount of \$175,000 to support the Mobile Integrated Healthcare Initiative. The funds will support the program by helping to reduce the number of preventable 911 calls through the use of community paramedics that interact with at-risk residents that frequently contact 911 for non-emergent health conditions. The integrated health team connects these residents with quality healthcare services as well as providing linkages to the most appropriate community supports.

The Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Systems Services (MEIMSS) awarded funding in the amount of \$9,000 to reimburse the County for expenses incurred for the purchase and administration of Naxolone which is used to treat patients that have experienced an opioid overdose.

Office of the Sheriff

The Maryland Department of Human Services awarded funding in the amount of \$3,046,898 for the Cooperative Reimbursement Program which supports child support enforcement efforts. This program requires 66/34 cost share of total program expenses. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$99,545 is needed to support the County's matching requirement, which totals \$1,035,945 for the effort.

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded funding in the amount of \$40,000 to support overtime incurred by the Office in an effort to apprehend violent offenders.

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded funding in the amount of \$49,808 to support the purchase and upgrade of equipment needed for high risk warrant and emergency petition services which will assist in providing additional safety deputies, suspects, and mental health clients.

Department of Corrections

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded \$20,000 for the Data Sharing Grant. Funding will integrate the Department's Offenders Management System with the Maryland Criminal Justice Dashboard enabling all partners to have access to offender history, offenders risk indicators and reentry information.

Office of Homeland Security

The Maryland Emergency Management Agency awarded funding in the amount of \$384,605 to support the State Homeland Security Program. This program supports state and local efforts to prevent terrorism and other catastrophic events. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$5 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency awarded funding in the amount of \$128,721 for the Exercise and Training Officer Program. Funding supports a project management position to plan and coordinate training exercises. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$421 is needed to fully expend this award.

The District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency awarded funding in the amount of \$128,721 for the NIMS Compliance program. Funding supports a project management position to plan and coordinate training exercises. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$421 is needed to fully expend this award.

The District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency awarded funding in the amount of \$362,928 for the Regional Planner grant. Funding supports staffing to assist with the coordination of emergency response capabilities in the event of regional disasters or emergencies. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$28 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency awarded funding in the amount of \$123,000 for the Recovery and Emergency Support Function (ESF) Management program. Funding will be used to hire a contractor responsible for the development of a Recovery Plan, the revision and alignment of emergency support functions and the review and update of the County's Emergency Operations Plan (EOP).

The District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency awarded funding in the amount of \$117,000 for the Emergency Operations Command (EOC) Exercise effort. Funding will be used to finalize, test, and validate gaps in plan and procedures regarding the Emergency Operation Command activation.

The District of Columbia Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency awarded \$251,500 for the Volunteer and Citizen Corp. Fund are used to educate, train and prepare citizens and communities for real disasters. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$10,000 is needed to fully expend the award funds received.

Department of the Environment

The Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE) awarded funding in the amount of \$158,824 for the Chesapeake Bay Regulatory and Accountability Grant Program (CBRAP) Design Work for Best Management Practices (BMP) Implementation at Municipality Sites. This project includes seven sub-projects located in Colmar Manor, Mount Rainier, Landover Hills, Morningside Field, University Park, Berwyn Heights, and Fairmount Heights. The objective is to evaluate locations with high pollutant loads, and design water quality retrofits for these areas.

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) awarded funding in the amount of \$150,000 for the Marine Debris Program, which requires an additional contribution of \$180,000 in matching funds from the County. The funding supports the installation of two bandalong litter traps in the Anacostia Watershed. The traps will be used in an effort to achieve the MS4 requirement of 170,628/yr. litter reduction. Funding will also support public outreach and a monitoring program.

The Chesapeake Bay Trust (CBT) awarded funding in the amount of \$50,000 for the Green Street, Green Jobs, Green Town Grant Program which requires a contribution of \$37,000 in matching funds from the County. These projects will treat storm water runoff and will be used for storm water demonstration and education programs for the citizens of Morningside and University Park. These projects will also support water quality improvement programs identified in the watershed management study to meet the local watershed Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) and Chesapeake Bay TMDL pollutant mandates.

Department of Family Services

The Maryland Department of Aging awarded funding in the amount of \$850,000 for the Community Options Waiver Program. Funding enables older adults to remain in a community setting even though their advanced age or disability would warrant placement in a long-term facility. The waiver

allows services that are typically covered by Medicaid in a long-term facility to be provided to eligible persons in their own homes or in assisted living facilities. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$300,000 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Corporation for National and Community Service awarded \$246,038 for the Foster Grandparent Program. Funding employs low-income senior citizens as foster grandparents to work with physically, mentally and emotionally handicapped children in centers throughout the County. These children otherwise may not receive the personal attention necessary for their social adjustment and maturation. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$5,000 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Corporation for National and Community Service awarded \$66,700 for the Retired Senior Volunteer (RSVP) Program. This program provides part-time volunteer opportunities to 500 unduplicated seniors. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$3,800 is needed to meet the matching requirements to fully support the programmatic costs.

The Maryland Department of Aging awarded funding in the amount of \$57,045 to support the State Guardianship Program. Funding provides case management services for each ward that receives Medicaid Long Term Care. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$13,000 is needed to recognize program income that will result from program services.

The Maryland Department of Aging awarded funding in the amount of \$925,435 for the Senior Care program. Funding provides coordinated, community-based, in-home services to seniors with disabilities who may be at risk of nursing home placement. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$104,535 is needed to fully expend the award received.

Senior Service America, Inc. awarded \$495,733 for the Senior Training and Employment Program. Funding provides for community service and training to low-income older County citizens and residents age 55 and older as an entry into productive work. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$21,923 is needed to fully expend the award received and cash match requirements; \$4,733 and \$17,190 respectively.

The Maryland Department of Aging awarded funding in the amount of \$57,150 for the Senior Center Operating Funds program. Funds support the Camp Springs Senior Center which offers a number of senior focused health and wellness classes and activities. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$17,150 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Aging awarded funding in the amount of \$13,835 for the Senior Medical Patrol which provides the public with the ability to report instances of health insurance fraud. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$2,335 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Aging awarded funding in the amount of \$205,000 for Maryland Access Point which currently functions as the County's Aging and Disability Resource Center. Funds are used to support a number of programs and services. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$45,000 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Aging awarded \$45,600 for the Hospital to Home Money Follows the Person program. Funding supports individuals transitioning from hospitals and nursing homes by improving the transition process from an institution into the community.

The Maryland Department of Aging awarded \$18,372 for the Hospital to Home Balancing Incentive Program. Funding will assist residents with the need to transition from nursing homes and other institutions back in to the community.

The Governor's Office for Children awarded \$544,409 for the Administration-Community Partnership Agreement. Funding will support administrative costs for the Division of Children, Youth and Families as well as the Local Management Board. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$49,609 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Governor's Office for Children awarded \$135,803 for the Choice Program formerly known as the Truancy Prevention Initiative. Funding will provide a prevention and intervention model for intensive case management designed along with a strategic plan to address the elementary school aged children exhibiting a pattern of truant behavior. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$23,403 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Governor's Office for Children awarded \$156,625 for the Disconnected Youth program. Funding will support youth going back to school or training them to acquire employable skills so they can become economically independent. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$69,025 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Governor's Office for Children awarded \$75,000 in funding for the Local Care Team program. Funding will provide compensation and operating expenses for the Local Care Team Coordinator to ensure youth with intensive needs receive comprehensive support services.

The Maryland Governor's Office for Children awarded \$1,000 for the Measurable Impact 2017 Conference. Funding will support travel related expenses.

The Governor's Office for Children awarded \$340,104 in funding for the Youth Service Bureaus. Funding will support community based, multi-service prevention programs serving youth and families. The youth served are those who are at risk of becoming delinquent because of their behaviors and circumstances and youth who have committed minor delinquencies. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$48,204 is needed to fully expend the award received.

DFS is using Earned Reinvestment Fund dollars that were earned from administrative funds and interest income to fund community counseling and mentoring services. These services were previously funded through the Community Partnership Agreement through the Multi-systemic therapies program (MST). Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$167,644 is needed to fully expend the award received.

Health Department

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$3,023,230 in funding for the Addictions Treatment Grant. Funding will provide outpatient and residential treatment to Prince George's County residents

with substance abuse problems. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$30 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$327,012 in funding for the Administrative/Local Addictions Authority (LAA) grant. Funding will provide administrative support for the Local Addictions Authority. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$12 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Juvenile Services awarded \$462,366 in funding for the Bridges 2 Success formerly known as the Operation Safe Kids Grant. Funding will provide case management and support services to juvenile offender participants identified thru the Department of Juvenile Services. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$112,366 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$632,342 in funding for the Continuum of Care grant. Funding will support services for people living with HIV/AIDS. This program consists of HIV prevention, treatment, care and support services. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$4,742 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$74,319 in funding for the Crownsville Project. Funding will provide the implementation of in-home intervention for children. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$19 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$131,637 in funding for the Drug Court Services Grant. Funding will provide problem solving courts and assessment case management. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$37 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$1,353,746 in funding for the Federal Block Grant. Funding provides assistance to consumers who are in crisis and to elderly consumers with special needs. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$215,446 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$102,555 for the HIV Testing in Behavioral Health Grant. Funding provides implementation of a comprehensive HIV surveillance and prevention program to prevent new HIV infections and achieve viral suppression among persons living with HIV.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$89,780 for the Maryland Crisis Hotline Grant. Funding provides for the Maryland Crisis Hotline Program.

The Maryland Department of Mental Health awarded \$50,128 for the Maryland Opioid Rapid Response (M.O.R.R.) Grant. Funding provides support for overdose education and Naloxone Distribution Programs for Prince George's County residents.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$1,760,665 in funding for the Mental Health Services Grant. Funding provides long-range planning for mental health services, needs assessments and the development of alternative resource providers. Additional funds support training to answer substance

abuse calls. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$2,265 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$189,660 for the Opioid Operational Command Center. Funding provides support to address the opioid epidemic and reduce the impact of overdose deaths in Prince George's County.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$502,172 in funding for the Prevention Services Grant. Funding provides community outreach services to prevent involvement with drugs via media campaign. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$12 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$166,122 in funding for the Tobacco Cessation Grant. Funding provides support to reduce tobacco use among targeted populations, including pregnant women and women of childbearing age and behavioral health (mental health and/or substance abuse) populations. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$13,722 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Mental Health awarded \$102,873 in funding for the Tobacco Control Community Grant. Funding provides support needed to prevent initiation of tobacco products among youth and young adults, including (but not limited to) cigarettes, cigars, hookah, smokeless, and electronic smoking devices (ESDs)/e-cigarettes. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$73 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Mental Health awarded \$13,271 in funding for the Tobacco Enforcement. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$271 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$593,102 in funding for the Public Health Emergency Preparedness (PHEP) Grant. Funding provides support for public health emergency preparedness. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$2 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$1,352,113 in funding for the STD Caseworker Grant. Funding provides HIV/AIDS clients with accessible, comprehensive and coordinated HIV medical services aimed at encouraging continuity of care and improving health outcomes through partnerships with community based organizations, and specialty providers. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$372,113 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$535,860 in funding for the Reproductive Health Grant. Funding provides for family planning services. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$17,680 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$889,742 in funding for the Geriatric Evaluation and Review Services Grant. Funding provides adult evaluation and review services. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$42 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$64,500 for the Zika Nurse Project. Funding provides Zika care coordination services.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$75,000 in funding for the PREP Grant which seeks to provide access to resources that will empower youth and their families to take personal responsibility for their health and well-being.

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services approved the carryover of \$631,461 from the previous 12 month period for the PGC CONNECTS Program. This program continues to support and expand crisis response services to those in need of mental health services and stabilization service enhancements.

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services approved the carryover of \$134,438 from the previous 12 month period for the Prince George's County Offender Reentry Program (PGCORP). This program continues to support existing offender reentry services provided through the Behavioral Health Services Division.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$49,143 in funding for the Syringe Services Program which will support the development of a resource directory, policies and procedures and the establishment and documentation of relationships with local stakeholders.

The Maryland Department of Health awarded \$2,025,524 in funding for the Maryland Children's Health Program (MCHP) Determination Eligibility Program. This program provides full health benefits for uninsured children up to age 19. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$62,724 is needed to fully expend the award received.

Department of Social Services

The Maryland Department of Human Services awarded \$244,519 in funding for the Emergency and Transitional Housing Services Grant. Funding provides for the operation of emergency shelters, transitional housing programs, rent/mortgage subsidies and hotline services. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$19 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) awarded \$220,007 in funding for the Emergency Food and Shelter (FEMA) Grant. Funding provides services to ensure crisis assistance for rental, mortgage and utility assistance for low-income households to prevent homelessness. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$5,307 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development awarded \$80,000 in funding for the Emergency Solutions Grant (MD-DHCD) Grant. Funding provides for shelter, outreach and housing support for unaccompanied youth ages 13-24 experiencing homelessness in the County. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$4,300 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development awarded \$10,000 for the Homeless Resource Grant. Funding provides for one-day, one-stop opportunity for individuals and families experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness to access services, resources and information.

The Maryland Department of Human Services awarded \$25,000 in funding for the Maryland Emergency Food Program Grant. Funding provides for short-term temporary food assistance to eligible clients. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$4,000 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Human Services awarded \$15,713 in funding for the Child Advocacy Support Services Grant. Funding provides support services to customers of the Child Advocacy Center. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$2,713 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded \$68,392 for the Supporting Victims in Transition Grant. Funding provides services to assists in developing and implementing strategies specifically intended to provide assistance to victims of crime in the State of Maryland. The cash match requirement of \$19,920 will be met by using an existing staff person's time and effort on this program.

The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention awarded \$25,000 for the Child Advocacy Center Accreditation Support Grant. Funding will assist in meeting the National Children's Alliance accreditation standards for medical evaluations for victims of sexual and physical abuse. A cash match of \$6,720 is provided through an existing staff person's time and effort to support this initiative.

The Maryland Department of Human Services awarded \$125,000 in funding for the Child Protective Services Clearance Screening Grant. Funding will support the processing of child protective service clearance screening for employees of the Prince George's County School System. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$75,000 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Human Services awarded \$550,000 in funding for the Family Investment Administration (FIA) Temporary Administrative Support program. This funding allows DSS to hire temporary staff to assist with case backlogs experienced within this division. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$83,000 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The University of Maryland awarded \$294,325 in funding for the Permanent Stability and Permanency for LBGTQ Foster Children Program. The Department of Social Services will serve as a local implementation site of the National Quality Improvement Center (QIC) on Tailored Services, Placement Stability and Permanency for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Questioning and Two Spirit (LGBTQ2S) children and youth in foster care. DSS seeks to develop, integrate and initiate best practices and innovative interventions that will improve outcomes for this population.

Department of Public Works and Transportation

The Maryland Transit Administration awarded \$340,508 for the Statewide Specialized Transportation Assistance Program which requires an additional contribution of \$19,839 in matching funds from the County. This yearly grant is utilized to replace aging paratransit vehicles. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$27,587 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Transit Administration awarded \$269,105 for the Rideshare Program. This funding supports the use of alternatives to the single occupant vehicle including mass transit, carpools and vanpools in the County. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$5 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The Maryland Department of Natural Resources awarded \$346,170 for the Ecosystem Restoration through Gray Infrastructure Repairs: Suitland Road and Regency Parkway Outfall Repair project. These funds will pilot ecosystem restoration practices in lieu of in-kind replacement and repair of failing infrastructure within easements and rights-of-way. The project will create wetlands, stream restoration, flood flow storage and provide sediment and nutrient pollution reduction. An additional \$617,869 will be leveraged to support these grant dollars.

Department of Housing and Community Development

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development awarded \$4,550,612 for Community Development Block Grant Program which supports a broad range of physical improvements for those areas of the County designated for redevelopment and revitalization. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$89,112 is needed to fully expend the award received and to appropriate the additional \$199,884 in program income received for the CDBG Single Family Rehabilitation Loan Program.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development awarded \$908,453 in funding for the Emergency Solutions Grant. Award levels were adjusted to reflect this one-time award adjustment for communities that lost significant capacity to serve the homeless after January 2016. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$519,253 is needed to fully expend the award received.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development under Title III of Division B of the Housing and economic Recovery Act (HERA) of 2008 awarded \$10,883,234 in funding for the Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP1); of that \$8,279,256 was for down payment and closing assistance. Any loan repayments received under the 1st round of the NSP down payment and closing cost program was considered program income. DHCD petitioned HUD and received approval and authorization to transfer NSP1 program income earnings to the Community Development Block Grant program. Additional appropriation authority in the amount of \$553,244 is needed to fully expend the program income earnings.
