SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,					
Maryland, that Section 10-235.26 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby					
added:

Sec. 10-235.26. Property tax credit for elderly individuals and veterans.					
(a) In acco	ordance with the provisions of Section 9-258 of the Tax-Property Article of the				
Annotated Code of Maryland, a property tax credit against the County property tax may be					
imposed on the dwelling of an eligible individual. For purposes of this Section a "dwelling" has					
the meaning stated in Section 9-105 of the Tax-Property Article of the Annotated Code of					
Maryland.					
(b) Fligibility. An individual is eligible to receive a property tax credit if:					

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1	(1) the individual is at least 70 years old; and				
2	(2) the individual has lived in the same dwelling for at least the preceding thirty (30)				
3	years and the dwelling for which a property tax credit is sought has a maximum assessed value				
4	of Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$350,000) at the time the individual first applied for				
5	the credit; or				
6	(3) the individual is a retired disabled member of the uniformed services of the				
7	United States as defined in 10 U.S.C. Sec. 101, the military reserves, or the National Guard and				
8	the dwelling for which a property tax credit is sought has a maximum assessed value of Three				
9	Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$350,000) at the time the individual first applied for the credit.				
10	(c) Amount and duration of credit. The credit allowed under this Section is twenty percent				
11	(20%) of the County property tax imposed on the dwelling. The credit shall be granted each year				
12	for a period of up to five (5) years if the individual remains eligible for the credit.				
13	(d) A real property tax credit shall not be granted under this Section if the real property has				
14	otherwise been granted a tax credit or exemption under the Tax-Property Article, Annotated				
15	Code of Maryland or the County Code for the taxable year.				
16	(e) Application for the tax credit established herein shall be made under oath on an				
17	application provided by the Director of Finance. The application shall provide a legal				
18	description of the property and such other information or documentation as the Director may				
19	require to determine whether the applicant can qualify for the tax credit.				
20	(f) The Director of Finance shall provide an annual report to the County Council on the				
21	property tax credit for elderly individuals and veterans on or before December 31st of each year				
22	for the previous fiscal year, to include:				
23	(1) the number of applications received;				
24	(2) the number of applications denied;				
25	(3) the number of tax credits approved; and				
26	(4) the location by Councilmanic district of the number of applications received,				
27	denied and the amount of tax credit approved.				
28	SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby				
29	declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph,				
30	sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of				
31	competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining				

1	words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this					
2	Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such					
3	invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection					
4	or section.					
5	SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45)					
6	calendar days after it becomes law.
