WHEREAS	s, there is an obesity crisis in the country and Prince George's County leading to		
premature deaths	due to preventable diseases linked to poor nutrition; and		
WHEREAS	s, according to the National Institutes of Health more than 2 in 3 adults in the		
United States are	either considered overweight or obese; and		
WHEREAS	s, in the United States people of color are disproportionately obese; and		
WHEREAS	s, there is a need for the availability of healthier foods to combat unhealthy		
eating; and			
WHEREAS	s, obesity can contribute to the onset of diabetes; and		
WHEREAS	S, undiagnosed or uncontrolled diabetes can lead to debilitation, blindness,		
serious heart and	kidney complications, amputations, and even death; and		
WHEREAS	s, incentives can lead food truck vendors to provide healthy food options to their		
customers.			
NOW, THE	EREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's		
County, Marylan	d, that this Council encourages the implementation of a Food Truck Healthy		
Options Certifica	ntion Program by the Health Department.		
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that under such a program the Food Truck vendors that			
agree to provide	healthy food options as part of their menu, become certified by the Health		
Department as a	healthy options food truck, agree to vend in healthy food priority areas for at		

least two days a week and at least four hours per day for no less than thirty weeks per year, would have all food truck hub, licensing and inspection fees waived. Certified food trucks will be provided a weather-proof decal to display on their food truck to identify themselves as such with re-certifications occurring on an annual basis

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Health Department will provide the administrative process for such certification program.
