1	Sec. 27-1902. Planning Board Procedures.
2	(a) The technical staff shall prepare a proposed CMA map and corresponding justifications
3	therefor to be reviewed by the Planning Board during public hearings and/or work sessions.
4	(b) The proposed CMA shall include the following information:
5	(1) A description of the area covered;
6	(2) The scale of all maps and a north arrow; and
7	(3) The boundaries of the proposed zoning classifications. The boundaries shall be
8	described on a map by either:
9	(A) Lot, block, and subdivision divisions;
10	(B) Streets, roads, streams, or other topographic landmarks; or
11	(C) Bearings and distances (in feet).
12	(c) [Within sixty (60) days after the District Council's adoption of a Resolution of
13	initiation, any] Any property owner or a property owner's agent may request that specific zones
14	(except Planned Development Zones and Overlay Zones) be considered for specific properties
15	during the CMA process.
16	(1) Requests shall be limited to the specific zones (except Planned Development Zones
17	and Overlay Zones) contained in the prospective Zoning Ordinance adopted on October 23, 2018
18	and if amended during the CMA process. Under no circumstance may any zone included in this
19	Zoning Ordinance be requested or granted through the CMA procedures.
20	(2) Requests shall be made on forms provided by the Planning Board and shall be
21	available for public review.
22	(3) Each request shall be accompanied by a statement describing the basis for any
23	disagreement with the application of the <u>approved</u> decision matrix by the technical staff as to the
24	subject property.
25	[(4) No requests from individual property owners or their agents received after the
26	sixty (60) day period following the adoption of the initiation resolution may be considered.]

1	SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Ordinance shall take effect on the
