Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs of study help students gain the skills, technical knowledge, academic foundation, and real-world experiences they need to prepare for high-skill, high-demand, and high-wage careers.



Vision for Career and Technical Education

Each student has <u>access</u> and the <u>opportunity</u> to engage in career programs of study that

- align to high-skill, high-wage, and/or in-demand careers;
- lead to earning industry-recognized and/or postsecondary credentials that will allow entrance and/or advancement in a specific career cluster; and
- provide career-based learning experiences that require the application of academic and technical knowledge and skills in a work setting.





Impact of CTE on Student Outcomes

High school students involved in CTE are more engaged, graduate at higher rates, and typically go on to postsecondary education.*

- Taking one CTE class for every two academic classes minimizes the risk of students dropping out of high school
- 91% of high school graduates who earned 2-3 CTE credits enrolled in college

- Dual enrollment, transcripted, and articulated college credits
- Advanced Placement courses
- Certifications and industry recognized credentials
- Scholarships

- Work-based learning and internship opportunities
- Student organizations and clubs that allow students to test their skills against peers and provide leadership development

CTE in PGCPS





- All comprehensive high schools offer at least one CTE program of study
- 3-year and 4-year CTE programs are offered to students at their boundary school
- All students are eligible to attend 2-year programs
 - A transfer to a regional CTE center based on student residency may be required
 - Transportation is provided
 - 2-year application opens in mid-October and closes March
 12th

P-TECH

Offered at Frederick Douglass HS with 61 students enrolled in either Health Information Management or Hospitality Services Management



Apprenticeship

There are currently 20 apprentices participating in the program. Students work full-time with Supervisors/Master Tradesmen in the Building Services Department the summer between 11th and 12th grade making \$15 per hour.



CTE Evening HS

Offered at Bladensburg HS with 16 students enrolled in either ProStart or Nursing with guaranteed industry related employment

PGCPS in partnership with PGCC, Bowie State University, and UMD College Park have set out to "Grow Our Own" future educators






How Can You Support CTE Programs?
