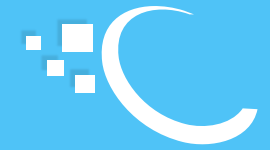

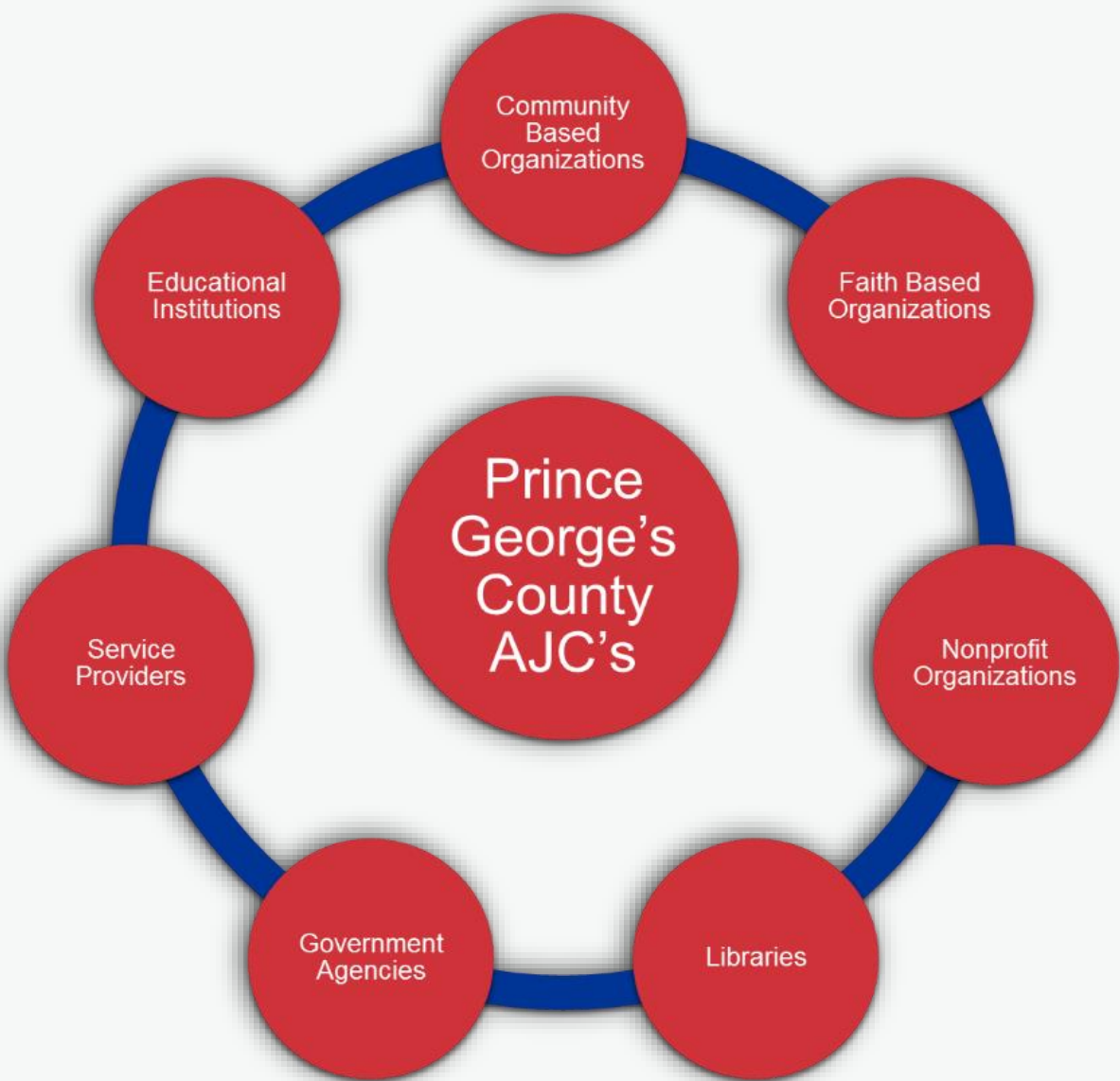

Closing the Skills Gap

Prince George's County has a mismatch in residents' skills and the needs of employers, creating a skills gap. This is due to lower wages in Prince George's County leading to an excessive amount of the County's most educated residents commuting out of the County for employment. Additionally, Prince George's County has high dropout rates, extreme public school absentee rates, the largest number of residents without a high school diploma in Maryland, and a large percentage of job seekers with poor literacy and numeracy skills.

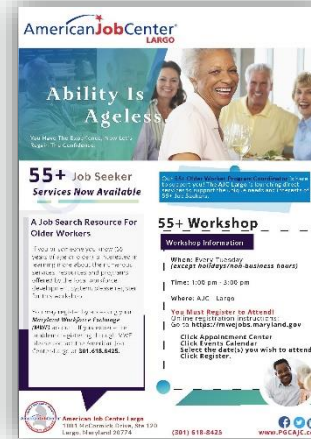
