FY 2021 Proposed Budget - Key Highlights

- In FY 2021, compensation is proposed at \$4,087,800. This decrease of \$202,000 or 4.7% below the FY 2020 approved level. FY 2021 proposed compensation decrease is due to a reduction of \$287,000 for unfunded positions to align with FY2021 Salary requirements and the addition of Fund Manager at \$85,000.
- The FY 2021 proposed budget includes funding for forty-eight (48) grant funded employees and fourteen (14) County funded positions. This reflects a decrease of 6 total staff. The following positions have been eliminated Director of Youth Services, Contracts Analyst, Administrative Assistant, Special Programs Coordinator, Intake Specialist, Reading & Mediation Specialist, Performance & Data Analyst, Re-Entry Business Consultant, and Career Consultant. EPG also added the following new positions for FY 2021, Director or Business Services, Career Consultant and Fund Development Manager.
- FY 2021 total operating expenses are proposed to increase \$608,900 or 50.6% above the FY 2020 approved level.
- The other sources of revenue that supplements Employ Prince George's proposed FY 2021 are from various other grant sources with the largest portion being the federal Workforce Innovation Opportunity Act grants \$4,299,700 or 58.3% of its budget.
- EPG's FY 2021 priorities include:
 - Provide workforce development services to job seekers and businesses with a priority of services being
 directed toward job seekers with severe barriers, areas with high unemployment and/or low wages and
 small-medium sized businesses focused on hiring Prince George's residents.
 - Staffing and managing the operations of the Prince George's County Workforce Development Board, including managing the Prince George's County Public Workforce System/Prince George's County American Job Center Community Network and serving as the fiscal agent of the workforce system

Budget Overview

Employ Prince George's ("EPG" or the Organization) is partially funded through an annual County grant in the Non-Departmental section of the budget, and mainly through the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act Grant (WIOA). The FY 2021 Proposed Budget for Employ Prince George's reflects County grant funding of \$1,851,700, or 6.5%, above the FY 2020 Approved funding level. Employ Prince George's total budget proposed for FY 2021 is \$7,370,900, which is \$334,100 or 4.7% above the FY 2020 Approved Budget.

Staffing Changes and Compensation

• FY 2021 Compensation is proposed at \$4,087,800, which is a decrease of (\$202,000) or -4.7%, below the FY 2020 Approved Budget. This decrease reflects reduction in staff vacancies to align with FY 2021 salary requirements.

Fringe Benefits

• FY 2021 Fringe Benefits are proposed at \$1,471,600, a decrease of (\$72,800), or -4.7%, below the FY 2020 Approved Budget. The decrease in fringe benefits resulting from unfunded vacant positions as Fringe benefits is a % calculation of compensation.

Operating

• FY 2021 Operating Expenses are proposed at \$1,811,599, an increase of \$608,900, or 50.6%, above the FY 2020 Approved Budget. The increased operating costs results from \$328,800 of expenses for administrative and contractual services, and \$280,100 increase resulting from a change based on the new methodology to support anticipated countywide costs.

Employ Prince George's County's Mission and Services

Employ Prince George's Division, through the management of the One Stop Career Center System, services as the link between job seekers looking to begin or change careers and businesses looking for skilled workers to maintain competitiveness in a changing labor market. The Prince George's County One Stop Career Center serves over 40,000 job seekers, and businesses annually.
