	EMERGENCY RESOLUTION	
AN EMERGEN	CY RESOLUTION concerning	
I	Emergency Operations—Public Meetings, Sessions, and Hearings	
For the purpose	of postponement of County Council actions, providing for alternative public	
participation for	meetings that are required to be held, and operations necessitated by the	
Coronavirus ("C	OVID-19") public health emergency.	
WHEREAS	S, the World Health Organization ("WHO") and the Centers for Disease Control	
and Prevention ("CDC") have declared the COVID-19 outbreak a "public health emergency of	
international con	cern"; and	
WHEREAS	S, the CDC and other public health authorities have advised taking precautions to	
reduce the possil	pility of exposure to the virus and slow the spread of the disease; and	
WHEREAS, the President of the United States proclaimed that the COVID-19 outbreak in		
the United States constituted a national emergency beginning March 1, 2020; and		
WHEREAS	S, Governor Lawrence Hogan issued a "Proclamation and Declaration of State of	
Emergency and	Existence of Catastrophic Health Emergency – COVID-19"; and	
WHEREAS	S, on May 13, 2020, Governor Lawrence Hogan amended and restated the Order	
of May 6, 2020 a	allowing the reopening of certain businesses and facilities, subject to local	
regulation; and		
WHEREAS	S, the Prince George's County Health Department elevated its recommendations	
to be consistent	with those of the CDC and is recommending social distancing within Prince	
George's County	y, including limiting access to public buildings, recreational facilities and the	
courthouses loca	ted in the County until April 6, 2020; and	

WHEREAS, the Chief Administrative Officer of Prince George's County issued a

memorandum on March 13, 2020, directing all County Boards and Commissions to suspend inperson meetings and/or hearings and restricting access to County buildings to only County Employees beginning March 16, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, Prince George's County Executive Angela Alsobrooks declared that a Local State of Emergency exists in Prince George's County; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of Prince George's County extended the Local State of Emergency by adopting CR-31-2020 on May 11, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on May 14, 2020, Prince George's County Executive Angela Alsobrooks extended the Local State of Emergency and the Stay-At-Home Order, as amended, for Prince George's County by Executive Order 8-2020; and

WHEREAS, all of the above referenced States of Emergency continue in effect; and WHEREAS, most public institutions in Prince George's County, including the Judicial Branch, have limited public access in recognition of the global pandemic posed by COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the global pandemic COVID-19 poses an imminent risk to the health, safety, and welfare of Prince George's County residents; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Prince George's County Charter a resolution has the force and effect of law but of a temporary or administrative character.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that all public/evidentiary hearings, including notice thereof, of the Zoning Hearing Examiner and Board of Appeals are stayed for a period that is the lesser of sixty (60) days or until such time as the county-wide emergency is lifted; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the time within which any individual, agency or official must submit a recommendation and/or response to the Zoning Hearing Examiner or Board of Appeals for their consideration at said public/evidentiary hearings, is stayed for a period that is the lesser of sixty (60) days or until such time as the county-wide emergency is lifted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall suspend, toll, extend or otherwise grant relief from time deadlines, requirements, or expirations in the Prince George's County Code, including Subtitle 27, except the County Council sitting in any capacity may meet to consider legislative or non-zoning related administrative matters.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all time deadlines, including notice thereof, for oral arguments or evidentiary hearings to be considered by the County Council sitting as the District Council on pending zoning applications are suspended or tolled for a period that is the lesser of sixty (60) days or until such time as the county-wide emergency is lifted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall take effect on the day it is adopted and supersedes CR-10-2020 which no longer has any force or effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that pursuant to Section 317 of the Prince George's County Charter, in the event of an emergency declared by the Governor pursuant to provisions of State law, which emergency affects any part or all of Prince George's County, and there is an emergent issue which precludes a Council meeting, the Council Chair or Vice Chair, in the Chair's absence, is authorized, upon advice and consent of a majority of the full Council, to modify the voting, quorum, and publication requirements consistent with State law, as necessary to respond to the emergency.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in order to address the public emergency and in light of the County Charter, in the event a public meeting, session, or hearing is mandated by law and cannot be continued, or is necessary for the continuity of government operations, the Council may provide for alternative public participation to include remote teleconferencing to address the emergency.
