For the purpose	of implementing, on an emergency basis, specific State and local government
directives for the	e reopening of eating and drinking establishments in Prince George's County,
thereby furtherin	g the economic recovery during the ongoing Coronavirus ("COVID-19") global
health pandemic	in the County, by temporarily authorizing the closure of public roads for
otherwise lawful	eating and drinking establishment uses the opportunity to offer outdoor dining
on adjacent exter	rior space or shared exterior space, under certain specified circumstances.
WHEREAS	S, the President of the United States proclaimed that the COVID- 19 outbreak in
the United States	s constituted a national emergency beginning March 1, 2020; and
WHEREAS	S, on March 5, 2020, the Governor of the State of Maryland declared
a state of emerge	ency and a catastrophic health emergency for the State of Maryland, which was
renewed on Mar	ch 17, 2020, April 20, 2020, and May 6, 2020, to control and prevent the spread
of COVID-19; a	nd
WHEREAS	S, the World Health Organization, on March 11, 2020, announced that the
COVID-19 outb	reak can be characterized as a pandemic; and
WHEREAS	S, Prince George's County, Maryland previously issued the following emergency
declarations: Exc	ecutive Order Number 6-2020 dated March 16, 2020; Executive Order Number
7-2020 dated Ap	oril 13, 2020; CR-31-2020 adopted May 11, 2020; Executive Order Number
8-2020 dated Ma	ay 14, 2020 and Executive Order Number 9-2020 dated May 28, 2020; and
WHEREAS	S, unemployment in Prince George's County, Maryland is currently at

approximately fifteen percent and many of the jobs created in the County over the last five years

have been lost due to the economic downturn caused by the current health crisis; and

WHEREAS, the Order of the Governor of the State of Maryland, issued March 16, 2020, closed all restaurants and bars to the general public and only permitted sales of food and beverages that are promptly taken from the premises (carry-out or drive-through basis) and to delivering food and beverages to customers off the premises; and

WHEREAS, eating and drinking establishments located in Prince George's County have suffered a significant decline in revenue while limited to carry-out, drive-through and delivery sales; and

WHEREAS, the Order of the Governor of the State of Maryland Number 20-05-27-01, issued May 27, 2020, along with Prince George's County Executive Order Number 10-2020 issued May 28, 2020, authorizes restaurants, bars, and other similar establishments that sell food or beverages for consumption on-premises to serve food and beverages to customers for consumption in outdoor seating areas, effective June 1, 2020 at 5:00 P.M., with certain limitations; and

WHEREAS, Prince George's County Maryland's has begun to show a downward trend in the number of positive cases, hospitalizations, and deaths; and there continues to be an increase in Prince George's County, Maryland's testing capacity, contact tracing and supply of personal protective equipment to support moving towards a modified re-opening or restart of certain businesses and activities; and

WHEREAS, restaurants, bars, and cafes are regulated as eating and drinking establishment uses pursuant to the Prince George's County Code, including its local zoning laws set forth in Subtitle 27, being also the Zoning Ordinance for Prince George's County; and

WHEREAS, the County Zoning Ordinance requires eating and drinking establishment uses to specify any outdoor seating areas on its approved Detailed or Special Exception Site Plan and to comply with all other provisions in the local zoning laws prior to issuance of a use and occupancy permit to commence operations of the use; and

WHEREAS, the Prince George's County Council anticipates that a significant number of existing lawful eating and drinking uses located in the County will apply for immediate authorization to provide outdoor seating or expand outdoor seating areas for customers and some may request the temporary closure of a public road to offer outdoor dining; and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of local recovery efforts resulting from the COVID-19 health

crisis, the Prince George's County Council finds critical need to allow for temporary road closures of public roads to provide certain eating and drinking establishment uses in the County the opportunity to offer newly created or expanded outdoor seating on adjacent exterior space or shared exterior space in Prince George's County during the local declaration of emergency caused by the COVID-19 public health emergency; and

WHEREAS, Section 23-162 of the Prince George's County Code authorizes the Director of Public Works and Transportation to temporarily close any County owned and maintained or other public road, or any part thereof; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Prince George's County Charter, a Resolution has the force and effect of law but of a temporary or administrative character.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the Prince George's County Director of Public Works and Transportation may authorize the temporary closure of any County owned and maintained public roads, in accordance with Section 23-162 of the Prince George's County Code, to provide certain eating and drinking establishment uses in the County the opportunity to offer newly created or expanded outdoor seating on adjacent exterior space or shared exterior space in Prince George's County during the local declaration of emergency caused by the COVID-19 public health emergency, after compliance with all requirements stated herein and the requirements stated in Council Resolution No._____.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, notwithstanding any provision of the Prince George's County Code, the Prince George's County Director of Public Works and Transportation may rescind forthwith the temporary closure of a County owned and maintained public road pursuant to this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the authority granted in this resolution to the Prince George's County Director of Public Works and Transportation is inapplicable to any federal, state or municipal public road.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the enforcement of the requirements herein and all other State and County laws and regulations for the temporary closure of a public road shall be performed as required by State or County laws and regulations, with the assistance of Prince George's County law enforcement as needed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall remain in effect until the

rescission of the State and County emergency declarations or terminated or amended sooner by Resolution by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall take effect on the day it is adopted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the provisions of this Resolution are hereby declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Resolution is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this Resolution, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Resolution of any such invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection, or section.
