This bill adopts the County's current expense budget and capital budget for the fiscal year 2021. It adopts an appropriation amount for the County's General Fund portion of the budget of \$3.71 billion, which is \$82.4 million, or 2.3% over the approved FY 2020 budget of \$3.63 billion. Overall, 65.8% of all General Funds are appropriated for Education (Board of Education, Community College and Memorial Library), while Public Safety receives 20.7% of available funds. Of the remaining 13.5% of County General Funds, 8.4% goes to pay for fixed charges and debt service, leaving 5.1% for Human Services, Public Works, Environment and General Government. The budget also establishes appropriation authority for all operating funds, including grants, Internal Service funds, Enterprise funds and Special Revenue funds that, when combined with the General Fund, totals \$4.48 billion.
