RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION concerning

The Juneteenth National Freedom Day Observance

For the purpose of expressing support for the celebration of Juneteenth National Freedom Day.

WHEREAS, approximately eleven and a half million African-Americans survived the "Middle Passage," a month-long voyage across the Atlantic Ocean stacked in the bottom of slave ships and were subjected to more than 200 years of slavery upon arrival in the United States; and

WHEREAS, more than two and a half years after the Emancipation Proclamation was signed by President Abraham Lincoln on September 22, 1862, Major General Gordon Granger issued General Order Number 3, on June 19, 1865, declaring that, in accordance with the Emancipation Proclamation, all enslaved people were free with an "absolute equality of rights and rights of property between former masters and those enslaved"; and

WHEREAS, Juneteenth, or June 19th, is celebrated each year as the date when the last enslaved people in the United States were freed and commemorates the spontaneous celebration that erupted among African-Americans upon learning of their freedom; and

WHEREAS, after more than 150 years of its annual celebration, Juneteenth has been officially recognized by the President and the Congress of the United States as Juneteenth Independence Day; and

WHEREAS, Americans of all colors, creeds, cultures, religions and countries of origin share a common love of and respect for freedom, as well as a determination to protect their right to freedom through democratic institutions, by which the tenets of freedom are guaranteed and protected. The nineteenth of June, or "Juneteenth Independence Day," coupled with

Independence Day on the fourth of July, completes the "cycle of freedom" for America's Independence Day observances; and

WHEREAS, the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland has expressed support yearly for the National Juneteenth Holiday Campaign; and

WHEREAS, the General Assembly of Maryland enacted legislation during the 2014 Legislative Session requiring the Governor annually to proclaim June 19 as Juneteenth National Freedom Day; and

WHEREAS, Juneteenth National Freedom Day, which recalls how slaves hated slavery and celebrated its abolishment with excitement and great joy, serves as a reminder to all Americans of the status and importance of Americans of African descent; and

WHEREAS, Juneteenth celebrations include special foods, an education and selfimprovement focus and a range of activities such as rodeos, fishing, barbecuing, baseball, and prayer services; and

WHEREAS, due to the current Coronavirus/COVID-19 Global Pandemic, the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission will host the 2020 Juneteenth National Freedom Day Celebration virtually on June 19, 2020 entitled Juneteenth Takeover of PGParks on Facebook featuring Creative Suitland, Aqua Williams, Step Afrika, mini-workshops, lectures, art exhibitions, and musical performances.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the Prince George's County Council hereby expresses support for Juneteenth National Freedom Day.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Prince George's County Council hereby supports the 2020 Juneteenth Celebration held virtually in Prince George's County and applauds all participants and encourages the participation of employees, families and communities in the virtual observance held on Friday, June 19, 2020.
