#### RE: FY 2019 Final Operating Budget Transfer

Dear County Executive Alsobrooks and Chair Turner:

This letter requests approval of the final operating budget transfer between major expenditure categories for FY 2019. The transfer realigns categories as of June 30, 2019, within the approved operating budget totaling \$2,047,732,000. The transfer is required to comply with state law so that expenditures do not exceed state categorical appropriated amounts.

This final operating budget transfer was approved by the Board of Education on September 19, 2019. This should have been forwarded to your attention at that time but was not due to oversight.

Although the final review indicated that overall expenditures remained within the current appropriated budget levels, transfers were necessary in the following major categories: Administration, Mid-Level Administration, Instructional Salaries, Textbooks & Instructional Materials, Other Instructional Costs, Special Education, Student Personnel Services, Health Services, Transportation, Operation of Plant, Maintenance of Plant, Fixed Charges and Community Services. All other categories had sufficient funding.

The appropriated budget total for FY 2019 of \$2,047,732,000 remains unchanged by this transfer.

# Board Action Summary

# An Outline of the Chief Executive Officer's Recommendation to the Board of Education

Subject: Fiscal Year 2019 Final Operating Budget Transfer

**Abstract and Highlights:** The financial condition of the school system is regularly monitored throughout the fiscal year with adjustments made periodically to meet evolving needs of the school system and to ensure fiscal stability. Additionally, as each fiscal year is closed, a final review is performed to ensure that, following all expenditures and journal entries, spending remains within state categorical totals.

This year, the final review indicated that overall expenditures remained within current appropriated revenues and expenditures. However, one expenditure category included restricted (grant) spending beyond categorical appropriations and now necessitates a transfer. Additionally, the review uncovered a technical error in a previous budget transfer, which requires correction.

First, the grant portion of the Special Education Major Category expended beyond budget. The restricted portion of this Category was insufficiently budgeted to meet actual grant expenditures and a transfer was necessary from the Reserve for Future Grants.

Second, the Financial Review approved by the Board of Education on April 25, 2019, contained an error requiring correction in this Financial Review. Though the April Resolution correctly represented the required transfer amounts, the categorical appropriations prior to the transfer were displayed incorrectly, resulting in incorrect totals following the April transfers. The attached resolution corrects this error.

The Public School Laws of Maryland require Board of Education and County Council approval of transfers between major categories. The resolution attached approves the recommended FY 2019 transfers between major categories and authorizes the Chief Executive Officer to request County Council approval of the transfers. Board of Education approval of the resolution is recommended.
