→ Total County Funding Requested: \$181 Million

→ Total State Funding Requested: \$59 Million

Projected Funding for the FY21 CIP is \$187,588,000

→ Total OMB Recommended Funding: \$146,944,000

(\$34 million less than requested)

→ Total State Projected Funding\*: \$40,644,000

(\$18 million less than requested)

#### Major Projects in the OMB Recommended FY21 CIP include:

- √ \$37.7 Million for four (4) new schools or modernizations of existing schools;

  (OMB Recommendation \$39.6 M)- Cherokee Lane ES Replacement, New

  Glenridge Area MS, William Schmidt Center, William Wirt MS Replacement
- √ \$47.1 Million in Systemic Mechanical (HVAC) upgrades at existing schools;

  (OMB Recommendation \$39.6 M)- Andrew Jackson Academy, Central HS, Robert

  Goddard Montessori
- √ \$36.7 Million in County-wide, county only, funded projects including, but not limited to, code compliance mandate projects, major life cycle replacement projects, security upgrades, and stadium upgrades; (OMB Recommendation \$37.3 M)
- √ 3 Million in Central Garage & Transportation projects; (OMB Recommendation \$2.5 M)

#### **COVID-19 Impacts on the Department of Capital Programs**

- Discontinued work in interior spaces during the Stay-At-Home
  Order in school buildings that had the potential to be reopened
  during the school year. Awaiting plan to resume work at these
  schools.
- Continued construction work at locations where there are no student and staff impacts (Central High School, Forest Heights Elementary School).
- Planning to move forward with selected Summer Projects, though some projects may be delayed because of COVID-19.



#### **COVID-19 Additional Considerations**

 Board of Education will consider a Comprehensive Boundary Study that will begin summer 2020 and continue for the 2020-2021 school year.

Continuing to move forward with Alternative Construction
 Financing (Package 1) solicitation. Under advice from P3 advisor,
 we revised schedule to account for market disruptions that may impacted overall pricing by bidders.

#### **Update Summary:**

- MOU has been signed by PGCPS and County Council.
- The ACF has no FY21 CIP budget implications.
- PGCPS received and responded to developer interim submissions.
- PGCPS is in the process of revising the schedule for developer selection due to:
  - COVID-19 related delays.
  - Contract terms/revisions requiring some discussion.
- ACF Availability Payment (AP) and Milestone Payment will require adjustments.
- Goal is to have selection completed by the end of August 2020.
