Dear Council Chair Turner:

Enclosed for the County Council's consideration is legislation to add June 19th as Juneteenth Day, a new, regular holiday to be established in Prince George's County. Juneteenth Day recognizes the end of slavery and celebrates the history, culture and accomplishments of African Americans in the County and across the nation. On June 19, 1865, Major General Gordon Granger issued General Order Number 3, declaring that, in accordance with the Emancipation Proclamation, all enslaved people were free with an "absolute equality of rights and rights of property between former masters and those enslaved" and Juneteenth, or June 19th, is celebrated each year as the date when the last enslaved people in the United States were freed, and commemorates the spontaneous celebration that erupted among African Americans upon learning of their freedom.
