




Health Department COVID-19 Vaccinations

COVID-19 Vaccines Given by Health Department

The Health Department has provided over 12,000 vaccines to date, including 779 during a special clinic on 1/30 for PGCPs staff in Phase 1b. On 1/29 we also provided our first mobile vaccination clinic at one of the shelters in the county.



COVID-19 Vaccines Given by Health Department

The Health Department **provided over 5,500 vaccines the last week of January.** We have utilized 53% of the vaccine received to date.



COVID-19 Vaccines Given by Health Department

Vaccinations provided by the Health Department **doubled last week**. The inclement weather at the start of this week will affect our clinics on 2/1, but our average daily distribution has reached around 1,000/day which will allow vaccines to continue to be pushed out through the rest of the week.



COVID-19 Vaccines Given by Health Department

One-fifth of vaccinations provided to date by the Health Department have been to education and child care staff, followed closely by 19% to first responders and public safety workers, and another 19% to health care workers. The “other” category includes nearly 1,300 vaccinations provided to those ages 75+.



COVID-19 Vaccines Given by Health Department

Phase 1a was largely determined by employment, not residency. As we have moved into phase 1b the **vaccinations provided to those 75 and older now represent 12.3% of all Health Department vaccinations** while they comprise only 5.2% of the population. Ages 65-74, who qualify in Phase 1c, encompass an additional 13.8% of vaccinations provided.



COVID-19 Vaccines Given by Health Department

Phase 1a was largely determined by employment as are many groups in Phases 1b and 1c, not residency. Despite this, **65% of all vaccinations provided by the Health Department have been given to Prince George's County residents.** Of those 75 and older vaccinated to date, 81% reside in Prince George's County; we anticipate this percentage increasing as we further refine our registration and outreach processes.






Prince George's County Resident COVID-19 Vaccinations



Resident Vaccinations


There are an estimated 728,050 residents ages 16 and older (the minimum age for vaccination). **Our goal is to have 473,232 residents vaccinated by this summer, or 65% of this population and 80% by this fall.** Through 1/28, **25,948 residents have received at least one vaccination (5.5% of our summer goal).** We anticipate revising our goal as new vaccines become available that include younger populations.

Vaccinations by Date Received for Residents

Over 29,000 vaccines have been provided to 25,948 county residents (3,807 residents have received their second vaccination) in Maryland. As we've moved into 1b we anticipate this number increasing with the inclusion of those ages 75+.






Residents Vaccinated by Age

Residents ages 50-59 have received the most vaccines, but by population we've seen an increase to 12% of those 80 years and older receiving at least one vaccine, followed by nearly 8% of those ages 70-79 years.

Percent Vaccinated by Age Group




Residents Vaccinated by Race/Ethnicity

The percent of county residents receiving at least one COVID vaccine by race and ethnicity was led by residents identifying as white (5.7%) and Asian (4.8%).

Residents Vaccinated by Race/Ethnicity




Percent Vaccinated by Race/Ethnicity (Ages 16+)

Residents by County Where Vaccinated*

Over half (54%) of Prince George's County residents have been vaccinated within the county. About 27% of county residents were vaccinated in adjacent Montgomery and Anne Arundel Counties through their employment in these jurisdictions.
