BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT:

The 2018 Water and Sewer Plan provides for four cycles of category change requests annually to amend the Plan. This Resolution represents the December 2020 Cycle of Amendments.

The 2018 Water and Sewer Plan was adopted by CR-64-2019, and amended by CR-75-2019, CR-11-2020, CR-45-2020, CR-87-2020 and CR-98-2020.

There are three (3) category change requests located in the Western Branch sewer basin, two (2) in the Piscataway sewer basin, and one (1) in the Mattawoman sewer basin. Additionally, the Department of

Permitting, Inspections and Enforcement is requesting to amend residential properties outside the Sewer Envelope to reflect the existing sewer service category of the residences connected to the public/private pressure sewer line in District 9. Finally, the Prince George's County Public Schools is requesting inclusion within the 2018 Water and Sewer Plan, for water withdrawal and point of discharge allocations at the William Schmidt Outdoor Environmental Center, District 9.

Environment Article, Title 9, Subtitle 5, of the Maryland Annotated Code, sets procedures for amendments and revisions to the Plan. At least 30 days prior to the public hearing on the amendments, the County Council must submit to the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission and the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission a copy of the resolution for their recommendations.
