

## Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP) Update

#### EMERGENCY RENTAL ASSISTANCE

**\$27.1M ERA 1** Treasury (up to 10% of admin costs)

\$27M ERA1 State of Maryland (up to 8% of admin costs)

- \$30.5M ERA 2 the America Rescue Plan Act (up to 10% of admin costs)
- **DHCD** is the administering agency supported by several community non-profit organizations

#### **Housing Stress**


Rent burden: 50% of income, Overcrowded: 1.5 people per room

#### **Social Factors**

 African-American and Latino population, population below poverty, number of single parent households (HH)

#### **Pandemic Effect**

Confirmed COVID-19 cases, employment in fields with layoff risk





Landlord Applications Received: 573


Tenant Applications Received: 2071

## MD CDBG CV 2 Alternative Uses

#### **BACKGROUND & PARAMETERS**

Significant funding passed in the last two Congressional COVID relief bills for Emergency Rental Assistance Programs (ERAP).

MD DHCD willing to consider amending grant agreements to allow for Alternative Uses rather than recapturing funds.

Milestones – 50% of funds must be expended within 240 days of the new award amendment date.

#### MD CDBV CV 2 ALTERNATIVE USES

- Prince George's Department of Housing and Community Development was notified by the State on March 30, 2021
   Alternative Uses.
- Deadline to respond by April 15, 2021.
- Notice from MD DHCD on April 30, 2021 to proceed with publishing a Notice of Substantial Amendment 5-day comment period.
- Letter to Council Chair regarding Alternative Uses May 13, 2021.
- Public Notice published May 27, 2021 (Enquirer-Gazette and website).





#### ALTERNATIVE USES

Stand Up & Deliver program will provide food distributions to residents with food insecurities -

**1.3 Million pounds** or **65,000 boxed** grocery non-perishable and perishable food items; and

#### 90,400 prepared meals

Benefiting **454,540** county residents

**Ten sites** that will be placed into a rotating schedule of 5 sites weekly from early summer through December 2021

Employ Prince George's will recruit and employ a minimum of **13 new employees** to assist with the program.

#### FORTHCOMING CDBG CV1 RE-PROGRAMMING

**\$1.7M** to be re-programmed from Rental Assistance to support:

- Community Navigators / non-profit partners
- Other COVID-19 response related needs

#### TIMELINE:

Solicitation of interest and recommendations: Summer 2021

Council approval: Fall 2021
