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**REPORT:** Favorable 10-0: Council Members Hawkins, Anderson-Walker Davis, Dernoga, Franklin, Harrison, Ivey, Streeter, Taveras, and Turner. Absent: Glaros

The Prince George's County Council convened as the Committee of the Whole on June 24, 2021 to consider CR-068-2021. As proposed the resolution will continue certain benefits for County employees called to active duty.

CR-068-2021 will continue to provide the following:

Eligibility for a salary supplement equaling the difference between the employee's county rate of pay and his/her military base rate of pay, without the employee having to exhaust their annual, personal or compensatory leave.

Eligibility for healthcare benefits to continue once the employee enters a leave without pay status, with the County paying both the employer and employee portions of the healthcare premiums.

CR-068-2021 will merely continue the same provisions which were provided under CR-019-2019. These benefits will expire on March 1, 2023.

The Office of Law reports CR-068-2021 to be in proper legislative form with no legal impediments to its adoption.

The Policy Group reports that CR-068-2021 will merely continue existing County benefits.

After discussion, the Prince George's County Council, sitting as the Committee of the Whole, voted CR-068-2021 out favorably 10-0.
