## **AFFECTED CODE SECTIONS:**

## **BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT:**

Pursuant to Section 10-192(b)(1)(B) of the Prince George's County Code, for Fiscal Year 20 each succeeding fiscal year, the school facilities surcharge shall be adjusted for inflation in account with the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) for the preceding fiscal year for the amount is being calculated. The school facilities surcharge applies to all buildings unless exempted from this requirement under Section 10-192.01 or qualifies for a reduction in the facilities surcharge.

The Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) for April 2021, compared to April shows an increase of 4.2%. The increase results in a surcharge of \$410 above the Fiscal Year school facilities surcharge of \$9,770 for permits issued for buildings between Interstate Highway and the District of Columbia and for permits issued for buildings included within a basic pl conceptual site plan that abuts an existing or planned mass transit rail station site operated b Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority. For permits for all other buildings, the increase CPI-U results in a surcharge increase of \$703 above the Fiscal Year 2021 school facilities surchar \$16,748.

For Fiscal Year 2022 the school facilities surcharge shall be \$10,180 for permits issued for buildings located between Interstate Highway 495 and the District of Columbia; or included within a basic plan or conceptual site plan that abuts an existing or planned mass transit rail station site operated by the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority. For all other buildings, the surcharge for permits issued shall be \$17,451.
