For the purpose	of observing Sunday, November 21, 2021 as World Remembrance Day for Road
Traffic Victims.	
WHEREAS	S, on October 26, 2005, the United Nations adopted a resolution which calls for
governments to	mark the third Sunday in November each year as World Day of Remembrance
for Road Traffic	Victims; and
WHEREAS	S, observation of this day provides an opportunity to draw the public's attention
to road traffic cr	ashes, their consequences and costs, and the measures which can be taken to
prevent them; ar	nd
WHEREAS	S, the World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims offers an annual
opportunity to in	crease public awareness of the burden of road traffic collisions on communities,
and to emphasiz	e the need to initiate and promote efforts to control this major public health and
development pro	oblem, and to assist victims; and
WHEREAS	S, on July 23, 2019, Prince George's County Government formally adopted
Vision Zero to re	each zero road fatalities by 2040 due the high number of preventable crashes on
its roadways; an	d
WHEREAS	S, the international Vision Zero movement seeks to put an end to fatal traffic
crashes and relie	es on data-driven approached to improve the engineering of roads, conduct

targeted education and enforcement, and to enhance the law to improve driver behavior and

increase penalties for dangerous conduct on the roads; and

WHEREAS, Prince George's County has reflected the nationwide trend that while Americans drove significantly less in 2020 due to the Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's (NHTSA) early estimates show more individuals died in motor vehicle crashes than in 2007; and

WHEREAS, NHTSA's research suggests that throughout the national public health emergency and associated lockdowns, driving patterns and behaviors changed significantly, and that drivers who remained on the roads engaged in more risky behavior, including speeding, failing to wear seat belts, and driving under the influence of drugs or alcohol; and

WHEREAS, the County's commitment to improving roadway safety for all users is paramount and observing the World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims is an opportunity to not only honor those individuals killed in vehicle crashes during 2020, but to shine awareness on the County's efforts to decrease the number of traffic deaths.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, joined with the Prince George's County Executive do hereby observe Sunday, November 21, 2021 as World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims; and, to the degree possible, encourage all residents to take moment to remember the victims of roadway crashes in 2020 and prior, and to recommit themselves to doing all in their power to prevent roadway crashes.
