<u>CB-77-2012 – AN ACT CONCERNING ENERGY CONSERVATION REAL</u> <u>PROPERTY TAX CREDIT</u> for the purpose of providing that lessees of a solar energy device or geothermal energy device are eligible for the energy conservation real property tax credit; and generally relating to the energy conservation real property tax credit. <u>PRESENTED</u>

<u>CB-78-2012 – AN ACT CONCERNING HOUSING CODE</u> for the purpose of amending the Housing Code to provide effective expedited code enforcement and eliminate needless delays to bring properties into compliance with the County's minimum housing standards, thereby protecting the health and safety of the residents and the community. <u>PRESENTED</u>

# **CB-79-2012 - AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING TRANSIT-ORIENTED**

<u>COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENT</u> for the purpose of amending the development approval requirements to enhance opportunities for commercial development in close proximity to transit stations in Prince George's County. <u>PRESENTED</u>

Council Bill 79 was presented by Council Members Franklin, Davis, and Harrison and referred to the Planning, Zoning and Economic Development Committee (PZED).

# <u>CB-80-2012 (SUBDIVISION BILL) - AN ACT CONCERNING SUBDIVISIONS</u> <u>– TRANSPORTATION ADEQUACY – TRANSIT-ORIENTED</u>

<u>COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENT</u> for the purpose of authorizing the Planning Board to make a finding of transportation adequacy for development proposals within a one-half mile radius of a transit station located entirely within certain commercial, industrial, Mixed Use or Comprehensive Design Zones, or in combination thereof. *PRESENTED* 

*Council Bill 80 was presented by Council Member Franklin, Davis and Harrison and referred to the Planning Zoning and Economic Development Committee (PZED).* 

# **CB-81-2012 – AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING PUBLIC FACILITIES**

**FINANCING AND IMPLEMENTATION PROGRAM (PFFIP)** for the purpose of clarifying that financing strategies for proposed and future development in a specified area include annual cost adjustments in a percentage equivalent to the percentage by which the Engineering News-Record (ENR) cost indices of local construction costs for the Washington Metropolitan area have changed. **PRESENTED**

# **CB-82-2012 - AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING PARKING IN RESIDENTIAL**

**AREAS** for the purpose of amending the regulations for the parking of certain vehicles in residential areas. *PRESENTED* 

*Council Bill 82 was presented by Council Member Lehman and referred to the Planning, Zoning and Economic Development Committee (PZED).* 

## <u>CB-83-2012 – AN ACT CONCERNING COMPLETE AND GREEN STREETS</u>

**<u>POLICY</u>** for the purpose of the establishment of a complete and green streets policy in Prince George's County; and generally relating to the County road and sidewalk code. *<u>PRESENTED</u>* 

Council Bill 83 was presented by Council Members Olson, Turner, Franklin and Lehman and referred to the Transportation, Housing and the Environment Committee (THE).

## (c) Introduction of Resolutions

<u>CR-66-2012 – A RESOLUTION CONCERNING STATE OF MARYLAND</u> <u>COMMUNITY INVESTMENT TAX CREDIT PROGRAM</u> for the purpose of approving the project submitted by the Patuxent Riverkeeper ("Riverkeeper") to the Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development for participation in the Department's Community Investment Tax Credit Program. <u>INTRODUCED</u>

<u>CB-85-2012 – AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING DRY CLEANING AND</u> <u>LAUNDRY STORE OR PLANTS</u> for the purpose of amending the regulations for dry cleaning and laundry stores or plants in Commercial Zones. <u>PRESENTED</u>

*Council Bill 85 was presented by Council Member Franklin and referred to the Planning, Zoning and Economic Development Committee (PZED).* 

<u>CB-86-2012 – AN ACT CONCERNING LODGING ESTABLISHMENTS –</u> <u>BUSINESS REGULATIONS</u> for the purpose of providing the legislative intent of the bill; requiring lodging establishments to have standard, posted check-in and checkout times; requiring certain identification of a registered guest; and generally relating to lodging establishment regulation. <u>PRESENTED</u>

Council Bill 86 was presented by Council Members Olson and Lehman and referred to the Public Safety and Fiscal Management Committee (PSFM).

## <u>CB-87-2012 – CONCERNING COUNTY RECYCLING PROGRAM</u> for the

purpose of amending the recycling program provisions in Prince George's County to establish updated recycling goals and setting forth the time for compliance; amends the residential recycling program for multifamily facilities, establishes a commercial and industrial recycling program and a pilot food composting program, amends the Solid Waste Management Advisory Commission; and generally relating to the County's recycling program. **PRESENTED** 

*Council Bill 87 was presented by Council Members Olson, Lehman and Campos and referred to the Transportation, Housing and the Environment Committee (THE).* 

<u>CB-88-2012 - AN ACT CONCERNING EVICTIONS</u> for the purpose of amending the eviction provisions for notification, removal and placement of tenant property and landlord responsibility in Prince George's County; and generally relating to evictions. <u>PRESENTED</u>

*Council Bill 88 was presented by Council Member Campos and referred to the Transportation, Housing and Environment Committee (THE).* 

#### <u>CB-89-2012 - AN ACT CONCERNING COMMON OWNERSHIP</u> COMMUNITIES RENTAL HOUSING LICENSE REQUIREMENTS for the

purpose of amending the rental housing license requirements for single-family and multifamily rental facilities in common ownership communities, allowing for suspension, revocation and denial of licenses in certain circumstances; and generally relating to rental housing licenses in Prince George's County. **PRESENTED** 

Council Bill 89 was presented by Council Members Turner, Toles, Patterson, Olson, Campos, and Lehman and referred to the Transportation, Housing and Environment Committee (THE).

# CB-90-2012 - AN ACT CONCERNING PROPERTY TAX - INSTALLMENT

**PAYMENT SCHEDULE** for the purpose of establishing an installment payment schedule for County, municipal, and special taxing district property taxes due on owner-occupied residential property owned by a homeowner if the homeowner is at least 62 years old and the property is not subject to a deed of trust, mortgage, or other encumbrance; providing for election of an installment payment schedule; providing for the due date of each payment installment; and generally relating to a property tax installment payment schedule. **PRESENTED** 

*Council Bill 90 was presented by Council Member Turner and referred to the Public Safety and Fiscal Management Committee (PSFM).* 

<u>CB-91-2012 – AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING ELECTRONIC RECYCLING</u> <u>FACILITIES</u> for the purpose of defining electronic recycling facility, amending the definition of recycling plant to exclude electronic recycling facilities, and to permit electronic recycling facilities in the I-1 and I-2 Zones under certain circumstances. <u>PRESENTED</u>

*Council Bill 91 was presented by Council Member Harrison and referred to the Planning Zoning and Economic Development Committee (PZED).* 

<u>CB-92-2012 – AN ACT CONCERNING ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND</u> <u>LOCAL EMPLOYMENT</u> for the purpose of strengthening the requirements for finding "best efforts" by vendors to meet the local hiring percentage goal; and generally providing for the enforcement of County-based business assistance *PRESENTED* 

*Council Bill 92 was presented by Council Member Franklin and referred to the Public Safety and Fiscal Management Committee (PSFM).* 

## **CB-93-2012 – AN ACT CONCERNING CONVENIENCE STORES – PUBLIC**

**<u>SAFETY</u>** for the purpose of decreasing robberies in the County by enhancing convenience store safety; registering convenience stores; requiring training of convenience store employees; providing for security, security options, and alarm systems, providing for visibility and signage; and providing for a grace period and for noncompliance; and generally relating to convenience store safety. *PRESENTED* 

*Council Bill 93 was presented by Council Member Olson and referred to the Public Safety and Fiscal Management Committee (PSFM).* 

# CB-94-2012 - AN ACT CONCERNING CONVENIENCE STORES AND GAS

<u>STATIONS – PUBLIC SAFETY</u> for the purpose of improving public safety by reducing commercial crime, providing definitions and the scope of the legislation; providing for staff, cash management, security and notice; and generally relating to public safety. *PRESENTED* 

*Council Bill 94 was presented by Council Member Franklin and referred to the Public Safety and Fiscal Management Committee (PSFM).* 

## CB-95-2012 - AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING USE AND OCCUPANCY

**<u>PERMITS</u>** for the purpose of providing District Council review of certain Use and Occupancy permits for compliance with an approved Conceptual Site Plan, Detailed Site Plan, Transit District Development Plan or any other site or development plan applicable to development of the property in order to enhance the availability of healthful eating alternatives, reduce detrimental food and beverage consumption, and to reduce blight, which is detrimental to the public health. <u>*PRESENTED*</u>

*Council Bill 95 was presented by Council Member Toles, Harrison, Lehman, Patterson and Turner and referred to the Planning, Zoning and Economic Development Committee (PZED).*

#### CB-64-2012 (DR-3) - AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING DEPARTMENT OR

<u>VARIETY STORES</u> for the purpose of amending the provisions of the Zoning Ordinance concerning Department or Variety Stores in the Commercial and Industrial Zones and making clarifying amendments to the Zoning Ordinance. <u>AMENDED</u>; <u>DR-4 INTRODUCED</u>

Council Member Franklin, as Chair of the Planning, Zoning and Economic Development Committee (PZED), provided a verbal report of the actions and recommendations from the Committee to the Council. Council Bill 64 (DR-2) amends the provisions of the Zoning Ordinance concerning Department or Variety Stores in the Commercial and Industrial Zones and makes clear amendments to the Zoning Ordinance. Council Member Davis moved amendment #1; seconded by Council Member Olson. Under Discussion: Council Member Turner explained her opposition to the amendment. Council Member Campos requested clarification about the difference between this and CB-13-2012. The motion carried 7-2 (Opposed Council Members Patterson and Turner). Council Bill 64 was introduced by Council Members Davis, Franklin, Olson, Lehman and Harrison.
