<u>CB-69-2012 – (EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 20-2012) REORGANIZATIONAL</u> <u>PROPOSAL</u> relating to the Department of Permitting, Inspections, and Enforcement.

On August 14, 2012, the County Executive transmitted Executive Order No. 20-2012 relating to the Department of Permitting, Inspections, and Enforcement. Pursuant to Charter 503, this proposal will become effective on October 13, 2012 unless disapproved by a majority vote of the full Council prior to that date. Referral to THE <u>PRESENTED</u>

<u>CB-74-2012 – AN ACT CONCERNING REVITALIZATION TAX CREDIT</u>

DISTRICT for the purpose of designating census tracts that comprise the Revitalization Tax Credit District, to reflect changes in median income as determined by the 2010 Census; providing information regarding the revitalization tax credit; providing for reporting and review of the census tract data; and generally relating to the revitalization tax credit. <u>PRESENTED</u>

Council Bill 74 was presented by Council Member Olson and referred to the Public Safety and Fiscal Management Committee (PSFM).

<u>CB 75-2012 - AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING MIXED-USE TOWN CENTER</u> (<u>M-U-TC</u>) <u>ZONE</u> for the purpose of requiring detailed site approval for certain development projects in the Mixed-Use Town Center (M-U-TC) Zone. <u>*PRESENTED*</u>
