Cristin Tolen, Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT) Sean Egan, Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT) Darrell Mobley, Department of Public Works & Transportation for Prince Georges Count Representative from Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA)

The panelists responded to questions posed by the Council regarding: equity across socio-economic classes; reasons for optimization proposal; timeline for public process; reason for single option; the proposed Resolution to approve the public hearing; on-time performance goals; comparison of times versus distance; timing of proposal; train over-crowing; operating subsidy; declines in ridership; safety; affect on Red Line and the process of inclusion of the Coumty in this discussion.
