*The briefing was convened at 10:14 a.m. Inez Claggett, Senior Legislative Auditor, walked through the proposed Capital Improvement Program for the Board of Education and the budget overview prepared by the Office of Audits and Investigations. Dr. Goldson introduced the panel guests and turned to Shawn Matlock, who facilitated a PowerPoint presentation entitled, "FY20 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Request Update-Spring 2019." The panelists responded to questions posed by the Council regarding: open-space pods, core enhancement, air quality assessments, Suitland High School location, lead remediation, IAC funding, modernization of schools and re-locatable classrooms, Crossland High School Vo-Tech renovation, Gwynn Park, local minority business participation, Cherokee Lane and related access road, Alternative Construction Financing (ACF), healthy foods and safe passages programs, playground equipment and parking lot improvements, Potomac Landing, forward-funding projects, school psychologists and bi-lingual staff/teachers. The panelists also answered residual questions regarding the board's operating budget such as: raining day fund/fund balance, teacher salary steps, salary lapse, transfer requests, compensation study and Title I funding/status. Mr. Valentine assured the Council that he would discuss the Council's concerns with the board and spoke to his efforts as an at-large member to assist the Council.*
