Tara Jackson, Deputy Chief Administrative Officer for Government Operations, Office of the County Executive provided an overview of the briefing on Small Cell Towers. Ms. Jackson explained where small cells can be installed and their uses and also provided a comparison between traditional cell and small cell. Possible loctions include public rights-of-way, government property and private property. Brad Frome, Manager of Strategic Operations, Office of the County Executive and Tara Jackson summarized the Federal, State and Local regulations regarding small cell, including the recommendations of the Telecommunications Transmission Facility Coordinating Committee (TTFCC). Next steps include, public input, development of design standards, determination of fee amounts, establish processes to review applications, determine conditions to govern access and coordination with public utilities. Additionally, the use of small cells on private property would require a text amendment to the Zoning Ordinance creating a "small cell" use category. The panel responded to questions posed by Council Members. Also present were Rhonda Weaver, County Attorney and Michelle Lyons, TTFCC.
