Ashley Kranz provided a brief overview of the Health and Human Services Needs Assessment of the County which includes analyzing data, interviewing experts and asking County residents for their perspective on the issue. The goal is to make recommendations for improving the health and well being of County residents. A report will be released to the public and is anticipated in early 2020.

Dr. Christopher King explained the Health Factors such as health behaviors, clinical care, social and economic factors and physical environment. Health in All Policies is a collaborative approach that includes health considerations into all policymaking activities across government agencies. This approach involves not just thinking of health in public health and health agencies, but also placing health in the missions and policies of all agencies.
