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1-495 & I-270 MANAGED LANES STUDY

Debra Borden, Principal Counsel for the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission facilitated a power point presentation which focused on what the Managed Lane Study is, the study area, who is leading the effort, what is NEPA, summary of the alternatives, steps in the NEPA process, State Highway Administration reconsideration and potential problems. Kenneth Battle provided a overview of the actions of the Board of Public Works and the P3 Program Phasing. Terry Bellamy, Director of the Department of Public Works and Transportation spoke to concerns about this approach that may not fully focus on mass transit alternatives rather than additional lanes. The panelists responded to questions posed by the Council regarding the phasing order, environmental impact studies, distribution of toll proceeds, estimated timeline, potential extension of the NEPA process, impact on parkland and stream valley, US 1 Corridor challenges, Purple Line impacts and the positions of M-NCPPC and DPW&T.
