Kathleen H. Canning provided an overview of the legislation and outlined the amendments included in the proposed draft 2. The Office of Audits and Investigations reported the enactment of CB-37-2020 would likely result in the need for additional upfront expenditures to hire additional staff to handle enforcement and the new administrative hearing processes. In addition, there potentially could be a significant positive fiscal impact through the collection of additional civil fines for each violation of the law. There would likely be a positive indirect impact to the community as short-term rentals would be properly licensed, insured and enforce of the properties would could be quickly addressed. In addition, enactment of this legislation could reduce the caseload in the judicial branch as this legislation provides the opportunity to abatement of the violations without the necessity of a judicial process. The Office of Law indicated the draft 2 of this legislation was in proper legislative form with no legal impediments to its enactment. Alex Dagg, Air BNB signed up to speak.
