HB 940 - Gaming - Regulation of Fantasy Gaming Competitions and Implementation of Sports Wagering

Rhonda Weaver, County Attorney, gave an overview of the resolution. Dr. Ernest Carter, Health Officer, also briefed the Committee on the status of COVID-19 efforts in the County and the need to continue the emergency declaration. The Committee discussed issues involving vaccinations including distribution, phases, and locations; issues surrounding bowling alleys being capped at 50 patrons; including the faith-based community as vaccination distribution partners; and registering seniors for vaccinations. An amendment was offered to revise the resolution to extend the amount of time the declaration of emergency stays in effect to 45 days.
