Additionally, the Department of Permitting, Inspections and Enforcement is requesting to amend residential properties outside the Sewer Envelope to reflect the existing sewer service category of the residences connected to the public/private pressure sewer line in District 9. Finally, the Prince George's County Public Schools is requesting inclusion within the 2018 Water and Sewer Plan, for water withdrawal and point of discharge allocations at the William Schmidt Outdoor Environmental Center, District9.
