Section 17-202 of the Public Utilities Article, of the Annotated Code of Maryland, requires the joint approval of the Prince George's County and Montgomery County Councils for changes to the submitted WSSC operating and capital budgets. This resolution recommends that WSSC adopt a 5.9% rate increase in water and sewer rates. The joint approval of both Councils is required to increase operating expenditures above the amount approved for Fiscal Year 2022. Any changes to the Operating or Capital Budget categories, which exceed the approved categories by 5% or greater, require prior Council approval. For changes below the 5% limit, the Commission may authorize the transfer of funds between categories.

This bill adopts the County's current expense budget and capital budget for the fiscal year 2022. It adopts an appropriation amount for the County's General Fund portion of the budget of \$3.794 billion, which is \$80.2 million, or 2.2% over the approved FY 2021 budget of \$3.714 billion. Overall, 65.9% of all General Funds are appropriated for Education (Board of Education, Community College and Memorial Library), while Public Safety receives 19.7% of available funds. Of the remaining 14.4% of County General Funds, 9.3% goes to pay for fixed charges and debt service, leaving 5.1% for Human Services, Public Works, Environment and General Government. The budget also establishes appropriation authority for all operating funds, including grants, Internal Service funds, Enterprise funds and Special Revenue funds that, when combined with the General Fund, totals \$4.56 billion.

**SANITARY COMMISSION** for the purpose of modifying the System Development Charge (SDC) to help finance the capital costs of expanding and augmenting water and sewage systems to accommodate service to subscribers in the Washington Suburban Sanitary District (WSSD) and to provide a financing mechanism to aid the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission (Commission) in paying for the capital projects thereof by providing methods and procedures by which the SDC is to be implemented and/or collected.

Section 25-402 of the Public Utilities Article of the Maryland Annotated Code authorizes the imposition of a System Development Charge (SDC) fee, and Section 25-403 provides that Montgomery and Prince George's County Councils shall meet annually to discuss and approve the SDC fee. The Councils met on May 13, 2021 and agreed to increase the SDC maximum allowable ceiling by a percentage equal to the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the prior calendar year. The CPI for November 2019 to November 2020 increased by 1.6%. The Commission is not increasing the SDC fee. The fee has not changed since FY 2000 (July 1999). This action provides the Commission with the flexibility in future fiscal years to increase the base System Development Charge for water supply fixtures with an assigned fixture value of 1 from \$88.00 to a maximum of \$134.00, and the base System Development Charge for a sewage drainage fixture with an assigned drainage fixture unit value of 1 from \$115.00 to a maximum of \$175.00.
